Community Honoree
Lincoln Almond

Lincoln Almond was the first governor of Rhode Island to serve a four-year term in accordance with revisions to the state constitution. He is a life-long Rhode Islander and was born in Central Falls.

Before being elected governor, Almond served as the U.S. Attorney for the United States District Court for the District of Rhode Island under Presidents Richard Nixon, Gerald Ford, Ronald Reagan, and George H. W. Bush, from 1969 to 1978, and later from 1981 to 1993. With a total of 21 years of service, Almond was one of the longest-serving U.S. Attorneys in the District of Rhode Island. While serving as U.S. Attorney, Almond emphasized enforcement in the area of organized crime, drugs, and white collar crime, including political corruption.

Almond started coming to South County Hospital when he moved into the area. He has been a consistent visitor of our Wellness & Fitness Center since 2014 after receiving treatment. He feels that the Center is a great place to get exercise with someone monitoring your progress. He said "I keep the Hospital going."

Sherri Zinno, Manager of Cardiopulmonary Services & Physical Therapy Services, has been at South County Health for nearly 30 years. She began her professional journey at Florida Atlantic University and Bryant University followed by a degree in Respiratory Therapy from Atlantic City Hospital. Sherri initiated a Pulmonary Program at South County Hospital under the direction of Dr. Anne Hebert. She also started a wellness exercise program, prenatal exercise program, the South County Hospital cancer survivorship and wellness program for all cancer patients and the out-patient pediatric cardiology clinic with Dr. Jim Ziegler.

Sherri was the 1991 recipient of the President's Award, an award given each year to an employee in recognition of their tremendous contributions to the quality of care and service at South County Health. Today, Sherri oversees our Respiratory Therapy Program, Sleep Lab, EEG, Cardiac Pulmonary Rehabilitation Program, Out-Patient Diabetes Program, the Out-Patient Nutritional Counseling program, and Physical, Occupational and Speech Therapy. Sherri is an avid exerciser and enjoys golfing and gardening in her free time.
