Margaret “Maggie” Mann, RRT, is a Registered Respiratory Therapist and Nationally Certified Asthma Educator in the Cardiopulmonary Rehab and Wellness Center at South County Hospital. Maggie’s career with the hospital spans more than thirty years during which time she has performed a wide range of responsibilities, including work in the ICU, pediatrics and emergency room medicine, and as an EKG technician.
